The National Association of Black Storytellers, Inc. (NABS) will present the "In the Tradition..." 39th Annual National Black Storytelling Festival and Conference! This year, NABS will present their unique gathering virtually for the second year as they celebrate the power of Blackstorytelling!

The first "In the Tradition..." Festival of Black Storytelling was held at Morgan State University in Baltimore in 1983. Since then they've traveled throughout the country and, now, their 39th celebration will be presented virtually. In honor of our Ancestors and in encouraging preservation of our traditions, this year's theme is "*Blakstorytelling M*A*T*T*E*R*S Always!*"

In 1982, nationally renowned storytellers, **Baltimore's first officially appointed Griot – the late, great Mary Carter Smith of Baltimore, Maryland, and esteemed Linda Goss of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and, now, residing in Baltimore**– founded "In the Tradition..." National Black Storytelling Festival. These visionaries then created the National Association of Black Storytellers, Inc., so that more opportunities would be afforded the African American storytellers to perpetuate the African oral tradition and preserve the folklore of African people.

"*Blackstorytelling M*A*T*T*E*R*S Always*!" begins November 6, 2021 by highlighting our talented **YOUTH!** Young storytellers from across the country will show perform stories in their own unique style as we affirm to them that their stories M*A*T*T*E*R*S!

Master Storytellers, as well as, beginners, storytellers with instruments and storytellers who dance, storytellers of all styles will entertain, inspire, educate and enliven the myths, recite the poems and recount the history of a people. **This year there will be many**
